Job Purpose

To assume day to day financial responsibility for all projects, from research, estimation, preparation, submission and negotiation through to final figures, ensuring efficiency, cost control and a high standard of quality service to the customer.

Main Duties & Responsibilities:

- Take a lead role in the surveying activities of the business and provide support/advice
- Manage and control project costs from inception to completion on a wide variety of new building projects and structures
- Assist in establishing client requirements and undertaking feasibility studies.
- Prepare tender and contract documents, including bills of quantities, and prepare and analyse associated costs.
- Conduct risk and value management, and prepare early stage budgets and detailed cost plans for all new projects.
- Advise on procurement strategy, new/alternative materials and suppliers, meet with supplier representatives, negotiate rates and update records and approved suppliers list.
- Identify, analyse and develop responses to commercial risks.
- Establish and operate cost and financial control systems.
- Continuously monitor the ongoing budgetary progress of all projects, meeting with customers to negotiate variations to ensure budgets are not exceeded.
- Manage all contractual claims through the analysis of outcomes and prepare detailed reports on progress.
